**** The following criteria must be met prior to the award of transfer credit from Granite State College.**

- Earned a bachelor's degree before starting a post-baccalaureate certification program at GSC.
- Completed an approved GSC post-baccalaureate certification program no earlier than January 2004. In the future, post-baccalaureate courses completed more than five years before the date of matriculation at KSC will not be considered for transfer into a graduate program.
- Currently certified by the NH DOE in General Special Education, Early Childhood Special Education, Emotional and Behavioral Disabilities, Specific Learning Disabilities, Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities, or Reading and Writing Specialist
- * Reading and Writing Specialist candidates who apply to KSC must present an Alternative IV NH DOE Reading and Writing Specialist certification during the KSC admissions process.
- Earned 18 – 26 post-baccalaureate credits at GSC. The maximum transfer is C&I = 24; SPED = 26.
 - Candidates with fewer than the maximum number of qualified credits from GSC will be required to complete 6 or 8 pre-approved elective credits at KSC. In this situation, it may take more than one year to complete the M.Ed.
 - GSC "modules" or non-credit bearing courses do not qualify for transfer.
 - Individual course grades below a B (3.0 on a scale of 4.0) are not acceptable for transfer to KSC.
 - Transfer credits can not be used to calculate grade point average (g.p.a.) at KSC.
 - An overall minimum g.p.a. of 3.0 is required for completion of the M.Ed.
- Completed at least one year of full-time teaching experience working with children and youth in an appropriate educational setting (pre-K to 12).
- Employed, on at least a half-time basis, in an approved educational setting for the duration of the program.
